

Collie is located in the South West of Western Australia, approximately 200km south of the capital city, Perth and some 60km inland from Bunbury.

Collie had its origin in 1829 when Dr Alexander Collie RN discovered the Collie River. The area was at first recognised as being useful as pasture lands for timber production, but with the discovery of coal in 1883, Collie's direction was well and truly set.

The declaration of Collie as a townsit in 1896 speeded the arrival of both lation and associate infrastructure, such as railway. Fror this humble beginning Collie grew to become an important town, supplyi the State with coal - the all important ays, shipping, and generation of electricity.

Timber was produced in abundance from the surrounding hardwood forest and agriculture sprung up on the periphery, but these were all subsidian to the production of coal. Coal and coal-related industry was (and still is) Collie's main economic base.

accompanied by Lt Preston, discovered and named the Collie and Preston Rivers. 15 COLLIE HISTORICAL RAIL PRECINCT ... This precinct includes the Old Goods Sheds and Bill Weir Rolling Stock Shed and

highlights the significant role rail played in the emergence of Collie as a source for coal for Western Australia. Access to rail transport launched Collie and the coal industry on a sound basis and boosted settlement in the district.



The Old Goods Shed, designed by C Y O'Connor, is the sole original remnant of the once important Collie yards, which once contained eleven lines and was second only to the Fremantle rail yards in size and importance. The shed now echoes to the sound of regular Sunday morning markets.

The Bill Weir Rolling Stock Shed displays restored rolling stock, coal trucks, timber dining and sleeper cars etc. Check with the Visitor Centre for opening times. 16 RAILWAY FOOT BRIDGE

Spanning 120 metres across the railway line, the original bridge was built in 1912. The restored bridge reopened in 2013. The bridge links the Railway Station and Old Goods Sheds.

17 SHOPPING PRECINCT FORREST STREET.....

Forrest Street is the major retail hub for Collie. There's a great variety of shopping and giftwares to be found in the CBD and along historic Throssell Street.

18 SOLDIERS PARK AND WAR MEMORIAL. A rose garden, war memorial and sacred stone honour those fallen in war. The entrance gates were erected as a memorial to WW1 soldiers, while the archway celebrates the State's Centenary in 1929. The Park is an idyllic spot for a picnic, with shady trees, barbeques, playground, gazebo and lawns.

19 COLLIE SKATE PARK.

This fabulous skate park, located next to the river and Soldiers Park, is part of a central social and recreational hub for the community. The Skate Park features a tight bowl, several technical street features and a number of transition elements from beginners through to more advanced sections. The area is landscaped, has a stage and seating, free wifi and is floodlit at night.

20 COLLIE RAILWAY STATION...

Museum, model railway, gift shop and cafe. Open Tuesday to Sunday.

21 FRED SCHARF PARK.... Set on the banks of the Collie River, the park features barbecues, picnic tables and playground equipment. A gazebo along the riverwalk overlooks the water. 22 CO-OP BRIDGE...

Constructed in 1955, with assistance from the Collie Co-operative Store. Floods have been a regular occurrence - in 1915, 1926, 1964 (when the river was dredged) and in 1982.

23 ARBORETUM. Across the river from Soldiers Park are various Australian native trees planted in 1922, which are floodlit at night. A WA Karri is at the eastern entrance to the river walk. 24 SWINGING BRIDGE.

This unique pedestrian bridge provides access across the Collie River. 25 ST BRIGIDS CHURCH

Built in 1935 alongside the original Roman Catholic Church which was later used as a classroom.

26 ALL SAINTS ANGLICAN CHURCH..... Built in the Norman design of early Italian churches, the interior features a lovely mural by artist Philip Goatcher, extensive use of local timbers and stained glass windows. Tours may be organised through the Collie Visitor Centre.

Both have been donated by the Australian Army and now hold pride of place in front of the Collie Cardiff RSL on Lefroy Street.

28 COLLIE COMMUNITY GARDEN The garden features raised vegetable and flower beds and an interpretive walk showcasing trees and plants used by the local Nyoongar people for bush tucker and medicines. The garden has benches throughout and along the walk trail, so you can always find a quiet spot to relax.
